

**BY-LAW #03-2019  
DESIGNATED OFFICER BYLAW  
TOWN OF SLAVE LAKE**

A BY-LAW OF THE TOWN OF SLAVE LAKE IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA TO ESTABLISH POSITIONS AND AUTHORITY OF DESIGNATED OFFICERS AND TO RESCIND BYLAW #01-2010.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 210 (1) of the Municipal Government Act, RSA 2000, Chapter M-26 as amended, the Council of the Town of Slave Lake, may pass a Bylaw for the establishment of one or more positions to carry out the powers, duties and functions of a designated officer.

The Council of the Town of Slave Lake, in the Province of Alberta, duly assembled, hereby enacts as follows:

1. This Bylaw shall be cited as the "Designated Officer Bylaw".
2. Those individuals appointed to perform the duties assigned to the positions set out within Schedule "A" of this Bylaw, as amended or by resolution of Council from time to time, shall be "Designated Officers" of the Town of Slave Lake pursuant to Section 210 of the Municipal Government Act.
3. Individuals appointed to the positions identified in Schedule "A" as Designated Officers of the Town of Slave Lake, may exercise the powers, duties and functions of a Designated Officer set out within the Municipal Government Act, or the Subdivision and Development Appeal Board Regulation or any other enactment or Municipal Bylaw, including but not limited to the ability to conduct inspections and pursue enforcement measures, except to the extent that such authority is limited by the Council.

Bylaw #01-2010 is hereby rescinded.

That this Bylaw comes into effect upon the date of its Third and Final Reading.

## **SCHEDULE "A"**

1. Community Peace Officers of the Town of Slave Lake, for the purpose of inspection and enforcement of municipal bylaws and the Municipal Government Act.
2. Development Officers of the Town of Slave Lake, for the purpose of inspections and enforcement under Part 17 of the Municipal Government Act, and the Land Use Bylaw of the Town of Slave Lake, including any permit, approval, or order issued under the Municipal Government Act or the Land Use Bylaw.
3. Subdivision and Development Appeal Board Clerks of the Town of Slave Lake, who have successfully completed training in accordance with the Subdivision and Development Appeal Board Regulation, for the purpose of carrying out all duties as they relate to Subdivision and Development Appeal Board hearings and the current Intermunicipal Subdivision and Development Appeal Board Agreement, Bylaw and Procedures.
